

## ITERATIVE PLANNING



Define: What is this project? Why is it important? What is in and out of scope and why? Why are we the ones doing it?

Project name



**Imagine:** What might we create together in a particular timeframe, say 3 years? Who is it for, what are their dreams? How can they be involved?



Design: Backcast to name achievements needed along the way to achieve this success. Say, at 2 years, 1 year, 6 months. Note assumptions, risks, roles, resources.



Adapt: As you reach each milestone, reflect and review. How come things happened the way they did? What new possibilities have emerged? How can we notice these and how can they be incorporated into what we do now?



Activate: Who does what and how? What are our approaches and tools? Develop and deliver actions for the immediate period, say 3 months then for longer as you go along. Experiment, prototype, test.



Discover: What do we have to build on? What works well? How? Says who? Who could we join with? What else might we need? How might we access that?
